DEFIBRILLATOR





Judith states:

"Be amazed at the extent of Rookwood, the largest cemetery in the Southern hemisphere at 777 acres. As we drive to the cemetery, hear how the cemetery was set up and how important funeral trains were from Sydney. At one time there were four railway stations inside Rookwood and we will see the remnants of one of them. Walk beside the serpentine canal and see the fantastic garden layout with shade houses and fountains. Picnic trains ran to Rookwood on a regular basis. See the graves of famous people from Bea Miles to the Hordern Family, the first detective in the colony, to a famous innkeeper and hear their stories. We will also visit sections dedicated to various denominations and nationalities — Chinese, Greek and Russian Orthodox, Independent and Jewish to name a few. Marvel at the streets of expensive mausoleums and hear of burial practices and customs from Muslim to Gypsy - and hear of funny stories too. Lunch can be taken at your own expense at the cafe within the grounds."

You just keep being surprised by successive revelations, including a walled sanctuary where solitude invites quiet reflection. Exuberant cottage garden, monastery garden, abbess's garden, huge collection of rare and unusual perennials, woodland, old fashioned roses and clematis, beech walk, lake, bog garden, orchard and kitchen garden.

Our day commences with morning tea at Lake Alexandria on the way to Red Cow Farm. Lunch will be at leisure (and own cost) in Bowral with a small amount of time to peruse the shops. Corbett Gardens is a lovely spot for a BYO or takeaway lunch. Following lunch we will explore Greenbrier Park, a National Champion Garden set in an old Australian eucalyptus woodland, 750 metres above sea level overlooking Mittagong with magnificent views of the Nattai Valley and Blue Mountains. The garden incorporates an English style design with Australian native shrubs and trees to produce a unique garden setting on some three hectares. Rich basalt soils and protection from harsh winds have led to remarkable growth since the garden was established in 1988. Perennial borders, formal lawns, streams and ponds, an "old cottage ruin", statutory, fountains, vistas and a large variety of shrubs, trees and natives make this a garden not to miss.
