#### SYDNEY FISH MARKETS - MONDAY, 25 FEBRUARY, 2019

Sydney Fish Markets - Hunters Hill afternoon tea and West Head Seafood Twilight Dinner

Date: Monday, 25 February, 2019 Time: 1:30pm – 8:45pm Cost: \$88 p.p.

Meeting: Park at the Harvey Lowe Pavilion on the Castle Hill Showground. We will board the bus in Showground Road.

Departing after lunch, our afternoon begins with a rambling drive to the Sydney Fish Markets on Blackwattle Bay. Our focus today is showcasing some of our beautiful waterways featuring bays and coves around Sydney Harbour. We will collect lots of fresh seafood for our twilight BBQ (including oysters, prawns, fish and smoked salmon) and there will be the opportunity to buy seafood to take home – eskys and ice will be provided for individual purchases.

Leaving the Fish Markets, we will travel through Rozelle and Balmain on our way to Hunters Hill for afternoon tea taking in many outstanding views across our fabulous harbour. Hunters Hill and Woolwich have an abundance of striking sandstone houses and we will enjoy afternoon tea in this delightful area before continuing on to West Head.

We will enter Kuring-gai National Park and travel out to Commodore Heights. This section of the park was included in 1951 and offers truly spectacular views over Broken Bay. While our sumptuous dinner is being prepared at the picnic area (a short distance inland), there will be time for a short walk to take in some of the most picturesque scenery imaginable over Pittwater and across to Palm Beach and Barrenjoey Headland and over the Hawkesbury River and across to the Central Coast, or just relax in the tranquility!

### **1. COOK ISLANDS - 9 DAYS/8 NIGHTS WITH ON COURSE TOURS**

**DEPARTS 13 JUNE AND RETURNS 21 JUNE 2019**

There has been a reasonable interest in the Cook Islands tour such that we have 13 members now going on this tour, with a total of 25 people booked for this tour. Payment of balance of \$3,365 pp twin share, (plus single supplement of \$1,225) as applicable, has been paid to On Course Tours, by all those members going on the tour. The tour documents will be available in about 2 months and will be given out to those going on the tour, at the Probus General Meeting.

### **2. RIVER CRUISE - FRANCE - AVALON WATERWAYS**

As expressions of interest have now closed and as there were not sufficient numbers for a group booking, the Committee has decided that the river cruises booking will not go ahead.

### **3. SOUTH AFRICA - JOHANNESBURG, KRUGER NATIONAL PARK, CAPETOWN AND VICTORIA FALLS - DEPARTS SYDNEY 30 APRIL 2020 AND RETURNS ON 17 MAY 2020**

The tour to South Africa will be a 17 day land tour commencing in Johannesburg and will include visits to wildlife parks and game reserves in the Kruger National Park, Capetown and Victoria Falls. All of these visits will be in the company of a Tour Guide. The emphasis will be on wildlife and scenery in South Africa.

The expected cost is in the range of \$10,000 per person, twin share, with a single supplement about \$2,000, including return airfares from Sydney to Johannesburg. Prices are indicative at this stage, and expected to be firmed up by early to mid-2019, after the 1st deposit has been paid.

There are 34 members with their names on the Expression of Interest list to date for this tour. The 1st deposit of \$1,000 (10%) is to be paid by the Probus General Meeting on **19 MARCH 2019**, the 2nd deposit of \$2,000 (20%) by the August 2019 meeting, with the balance payable by the January 2020 Meeting. The tour Brochure with an Itinerary of 13 pages is available and has been emailed to all members. Hard copies of these brochures, from the Travel Agent, were available to all interested members at the January 2019 meeting. There are a few copies remaining.
